## MEETING WITH NDMA OFFICIALS

**MARCH, 2026**

Director Youth Programme, PBSA, Mr. Zahid Mahboob, visited the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) Headquarters in Islamabad to explore avenues of mutual cooperation and strategic partnership. During the visit, matters of common interest were discussed in detail for enhancing collaboration between PBSA and NDMA, particularly in the areas of disaster preparedness, emergency response, community resilience, and capacity building of youth. Role of Scouts in supporting national efforts during emergencies and natural disasters was emphasized. It was also acknowledged that the disciplined structure and widespread presence of Scouts across the country make them a valuable asset in disaster risk reduction initiatives. Ongoing contributions of PBSA in promoting community service and youth engagement were also appreciated. They also expressed their willingness to work closely with PBSA in organizing joint training programs, awareness campaigns, and simulation exercises aimed at equipping Scouts with essential disaster management skills. PBSA's commitment reiterated to aligning its youth programmes with national priorities and assured full cooperation in strengthening the partnership with NDMA for the benefit of communities across Pakistan. The meeting concluded on a positive note, with both organizations agreeing to develop a structured framework for future collaboration to enhance preparedness and response mechanisms at the grassroots level.



## MEETING WITH UNICEF OFFICIALS

A delegation of PBSA participated in a seminar on Learning & Skills organized by UNICEF under the banner of Prime Minister's Youth Program, aimed at promoting innovative approaches to youth development and capacity building. The seminar brought together stakeholders from various sectors to deliberate on strategies for equipping young people with essential skills required to meet contemporary challenges. On the sidelines of the seminar, the PBSA delegation had a productive meeting with Ms. Aurelia Ardito, Chief of Learning & Skills at UNICEF. During the meeting, both sides discussed potential avenues of collaboration and explored practical ways and means to expand learning opportunities for Scouts across Pakistan. The discussion focused on enhancing access to skill-based education, promoting youth empowerment initiatives, and integrating modern learning methodologies within the Scouting framework. Ms. Aurelia Ardito appreciated the role of PBSA in nurturing responsible and skilled youth and expressed interest in exploring future partnerships.



## MESSAGE OF ACTING CHIEF COMMISSIONER, PBSA

Acting Chief Commissioner, Pakistan Boy Scouts Association, Hafiz Tariq Mehmood, issued a special message addressed to the Scout fraternity under the title: "The Role of a Responsible Scout in the Present National Situation." 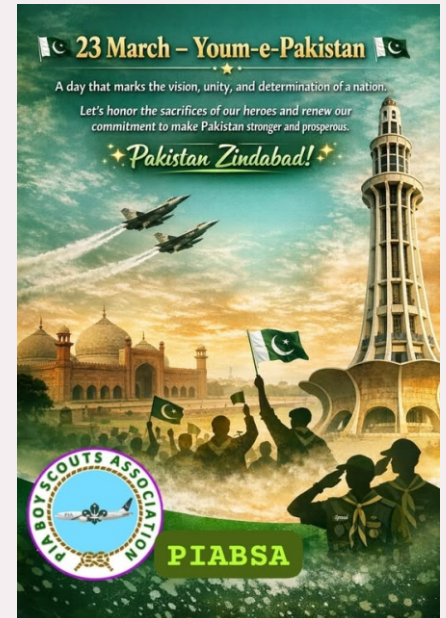
