15th Provincial Secretaries Committee Meeting was held on 25 April 2026 at the National Headquarters under the chairmanship of Hafiz Tariq Mehmood, Acting Chief Commissioner, PBSA. The meeting brought together Provincial Secretaries to review ongoing scouting activities. At the outset, the Chair welcomed the

The agenda focused on strengthening institutional coordination, improving reporting systems, and enhancing the delivery of scouting programs across provinces. The meeting of the National Adult Training Sub-Committee was successfully held on 24 April 2026 at the National Headquarters PBSA under the Chair of Mr. Liaqat Ali Awan, Director Adult Training, PBSA through online (Zoom). The meeting was attended by nominated representatives from all Provincial Scout Associations, who actively participated in the proceedings and contributed to constructive deliberations on the agenda items. Key matters relating to the enhancement of adult training standards, capacity-building of trainers, and improvement in the delivery and coordination of training were discussed in detail. The participants emphasized the



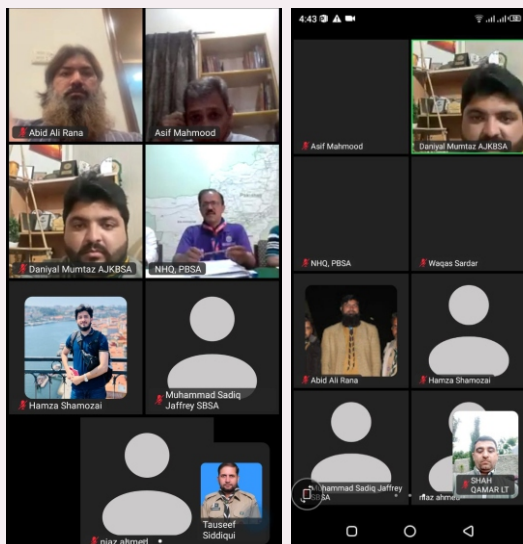
need for a structured, uniform, and modernized training framework to further strengthen the quality of leadership within the scouting movement.



NATIONAL YOUTH PROGRAMME SUB-COMMITTEE MEETING

24 APRIL, 2026

National Youth Programme Sub-Committee meeting was held on 24 April 2026 at the National Headquarters PBSA under the Chair of Mr. Zahid Mahboob, Director Youth Programme, PBSA through online (Zoom). The session was attended by nominated representatives from all Provincial Scout Associations, who



actively engaged in discussions on key aspects of youth

programme development and implementation. Deliberations focused on strengthening the existing youth programme framework, enhancing its relevance to contemporary youth needs, and promoting greater participation at all levels. The participants also reviewed strategies to improve programme delivery, outreach, and impact across provinces. The Sub-Committee emphasized the importance of innovation, inclusivity, and consistency in youth engagement initiatives to further strengthen the scouting movement in Pakistan. Annual Calendar of Youth Programme was also discussed and finalized for further submission to the Provincial Secretaries Meeting.

MEETING WITH HON'BLE FEDERAL MINISTER FOR RELIGIOUS AFFAIRS AND INTERFAITH HARMONY

Hafiz Tariq Mehmood, Acting Chief Commissioner, Pakistan Boy Scouts Association held a meeting with Sardar Muhammad Yousaf, Federal Minister for Religious Affairs and Interfaith Harmony, in Islamabad. The meeting focused on matters of mutual interest, particularly the proposed allocation of a quota of 50 Scout Leaders as Moavineen-e-Hujjaj for Hajj 2027 in Saudi Arabia, aimed at providing support and facilitation to Pakistani pilgrims during the Hajj season. BE PREAPRED

TO SAVE YOURSELVES & PEOPLE AROUND YOU

NDMA, Tech Early Warning (EW) Team has anticipated that daytime temperatures during **May to June** will remain **above normal**. Given these conditions, all relevant stakeholders are advised to implement the following proactive measures to prepare for and respond to the anticipated heatwave:-

Educational institutions, NGOs and community organizations should educate students and local communities on recognizing heatstroke symptoms, emergency procedures and how to access medical support.

Individual Preventive Measures:

- (1) Stay **well-hydrated**; carry and drink plenty of clean water throughout the day.
- (2) Avoid **direct exposure to sunlight**, especially during peak hours (**10:00 AM to 5:00 PM**).
- (3) Keep **informed of local weather conditions** through reliable media or mobile applications.
- (4) Use **curtains, shades or blinds** to reduce indoor heat from sunlight.
- (5) Place **fans near windows** during nighttime to improve ventilation and indoor cooling.
- (6) Install **green shades** outside windows to naturally lower indoor temperatures.
- (7) Use **reflective materials (e.g., aluminum foil)** on windows to deflect sunlight and reduce indoor heat.
- (8) Promote the use of appropriate **protective measures**, such as **lightweight, loose-fitting and light-colored clothing**, along with **SPF and hats**.
- (9) In case of **symptoms** like **dizziness, nausea, or weakness**, **consult a doctor immediately**.
- (10) Plan outdoor work or **physical activity** during **cooler parts of the day** and avoid unnecessary travel.
- (11) Give **special attention to the elderly, infants and those with pre-existing health conditions**.
- (12) **Farmers** are advised to manage their **crop activities** keeping in view the **weather conditions** and take care of their **livestock** as well.

Additional Recommendations:

- (1) Media to run **heatwave awareness messages and health tips**.
- (2) Coordinate with **WASA/ municipal bodies** to ensure **uninterrupted water supply** in heat- prone localities.
- (3) Encourage community centers and public institutions to serve as **temporary cooling shelters**.
- (4) Ensure **hydration corners or water booths** at major public gathering points **such as markets, bus terminals and parks**.

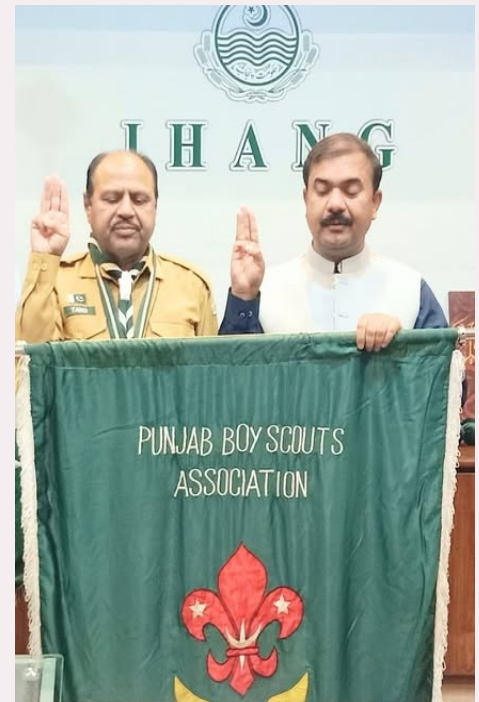
