MONSOON COORDINATION CONFERENCE 2026

National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) organized the Monsoon Coordination Conference 2026 at its Headquarters in Islamabad to review preparedness measures and strengthen coordination among relevant stakeholders for the upcoming monsoon season. The conference brought together representatives from federal and provincial government departments, emergency response organizations, humanitarian partners, and volunteer agencies to discuss coordinated strategies for effective disaster preparedness, response, and risk mitigation during the monsoon period.

During the conference, participants held detailed discussions on the prevailing weather conditions across the country, particularly the ongoing heatwave, and assessed the potential risks associated with the upcoming monsoon season. Special emphasis was placed on preparedness for flash floods, urban flooding, riverine floods, cloudburst incidents, and other weather-induced emergencies, along with the importance of coordinated response mechanisms to minimize the impact on vulnerable communities.



Representing the Pakistan Boy Scouts Association (PBSA), the Director Youth Programme attended the conference and reaffirmed PBSA's commitment to supporting national disaster risk reduction initiatives through its trained Scout volunteers. The

participation highlighted the Association's continued role in promoting community resilience, emergency preparedness, and volunteerism in collaboration with NDMA and other partner organizations.
