SIMULATION EXERCISE WITH NDMA INTERNEES

DRM Activity by Pakistan Boy Scouts Association

NDMA Internship Program -2026

As part of the NDMA Internship Programme 2026, interns participated in a one-day



Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) activity organized by the Pakistan Boy Scouts Association (PBSA). The session introduced interns to the fundamentals of camp setup and management, Community-Based Disaster Management (CBDM), and the vital role of volunteerism in strengthening disaster preparedness and community resilience. Through practical demonstrations, the interns gained hands-on



experience in the erection and dismantling of emergency camps, providing valuable insight into camp management during disaster response operations. The activity also featured simulated earthquake emergency response scenario, enabling interns to experience disaster settings and understand the importance of coordinated response mechanisms and community engagement in disaster management.

NATIONAL INSAR MULTI HAZARD SIMULATION EXERCISE-2026 OF NDMA

National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) organized a comprehensive Monsoon Alerts and Preparedness meetings under the Chair of Lt. Gen. Inam Haider Malik, Chairman, NDMA to enhance awareness regarding the increasing risks posed by extreme floods, and heat wave conditions and to strengthen coordinated preparedness measures among government departments, development partners, educational institutions, and volunteer organizations. The session was attended by representatives from various national organizations, including the Pakistan Boy Scouts



Association (PBSA), represented by the Director Youth Programme and reaffirmed the Association's commitment to supporting national disaster risk reduction initiatives. He emphasized that Scouts, owing to their extensive presence at the grassroots level and their tradition of voluntary community service, can play a vital role in disseminating heat wave safety messages, assisting local authorities during emergencies, and promoting climate resilience among communities. Rep. of PDMA GB informed the forum that Scouts from GB actively participated in the Relief Activities near Gilgit city.

EDUCATION IN EMERGENCY TRAINING

United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) organized a two-day Education in Emergencies (EiE) Training from 13 to 14 July 2026 at the Pakistan Girl Guides Association (PGGA) Headquarters, Islamabad. The training brought together representatives from government departments, humanitarian organizations, and youth-serving institutions to strengthen coordination and preparedness for ensuring

The presentation showcased the vital role of Scouts as trained community volunteers who actively support disaster preparedness, emergency response, relief operations, first aid services, evacuation assistance, awareness campaigns, and community resilience initiatives throughout Pakistan.

ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION ON THE STATE OF THE DRUG

On the invitation of Karim Khan Afridi Welfare Foundation (KKAWF), Mr. Zahid Mahboob, Director Youth Programme, Pakistan Boy Scouts Association (PBSA), attended a Roundtable Discussion on the State of Drug Use in Pakistan, organized by the KKAWF in collaboration with Green Crescent Türkiye. 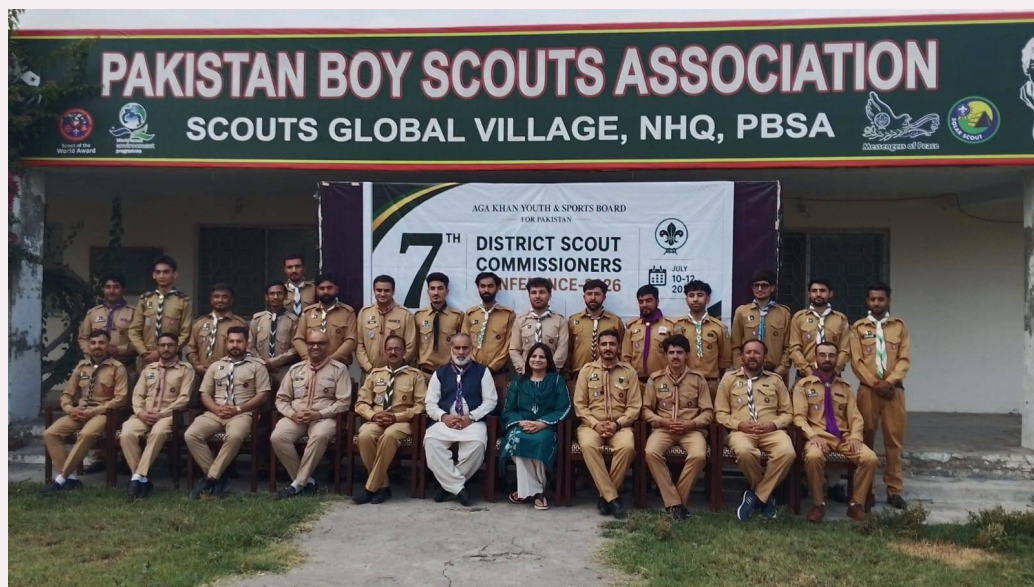

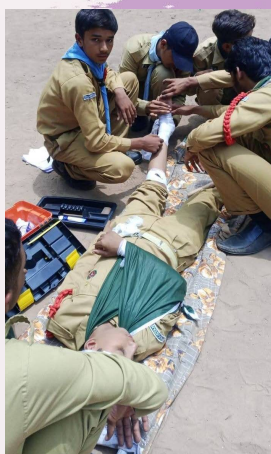

PSSC Batrasi Faculty Capacity Building Workshop 2026



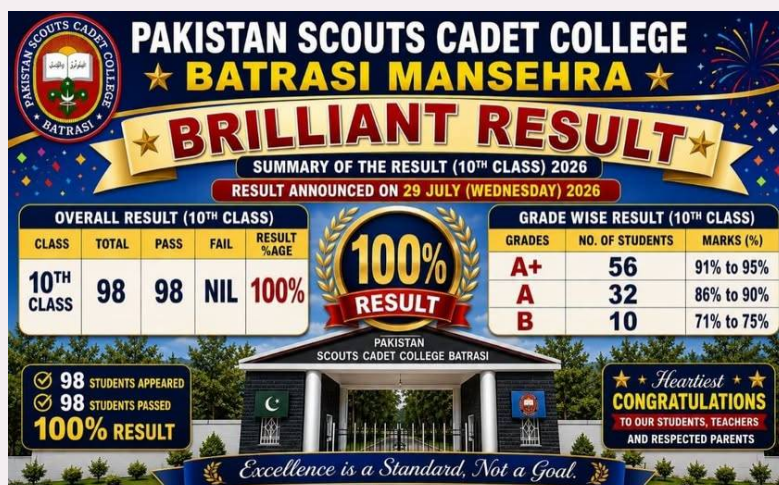
